Baddley (At-Large) is President and CEO of the YMCA of Greenville, leads an eleven site -YMCA - including multiple family branch facilities, a year-round residential camp – Camp Greenville, community outreach centers, and program centers. As South Carolina's largest Y, the YMCA of Greenville serves more than 80,000 people annually. Scot chairs the Greenville Health Authority Lease Review Committee.

Active in the community, Scot has served as a member of the Greenville Forward Advisory board, past member of the Governor’s Council on Physical Fitness for South Carolina, and is a Furman University Riley Fellow. Work History: John Mansure has worked for Prisma Health, formerly Greenville Health System (GHS), for 40 years. He has served the Greer Memorial Hospital Campus since 2008 first as President and now CEO of the campus.

Mansure oversaw construction and planning for the \$100 million, 130-acre Greer campus in his previous position as head of GHS' Facilities Development and Campus Planning. In addition to overseeing development and construction of the Greer campus, Mansure also oversaw all facets of construction and implementation for the \$67 million heart and Children's Hospital expansion; a \$10 million administrative support tower; \$16 million bed expansion; and nearly 20 smaller concurrent projects.

During his tenure, John has served in various administrative roles, including overseeing medical and surgical services as well as care support services at Greenville Memorial. He began his career in 1979 as an Administrative Resident, a position that grew into a job entailing the facilitation of the transition of the Greenville General Hospital to an expanded Greenville Memorial in 1982.
